

Deer Park Middle Magnet School's Reopening Information

Arrival Entry into the Building: 8:00 a.m.

Dismissal from the Building: 2:40 p.m.

Introductory Statement: Deer Park Middle Magnet School: A learning community that inspires every individual to rise above every challenge, every day. We are Dedicated, Prepared, Motivated, Mindful, and Successful. The reopening information below reflects DPMMS's dedication and preparation for safety during hybrid instruction.

<p><u>Arrival & Dismissal Procedures:</u></p> <p><u>ARRIVAL</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Upon arrival students will walk to their grade level area. Grade 6: the front door and line up along the grass. Grade 7: will walk around the right side (tennis court side) to the 30's/40's hallway outside door line up on the sidewalk. Grade 8- will walk to the CAC doors and line up at the ramp and the other side of the stairwell. Students will be allowed entrance (one at a time) at 8 a.m. when the bell rings. Social distance markings are labeled on the sidewalk. • Team leaders, AP, and a teacher will monitor the lines outside while waiting for the bell to check for all students having a mask on their face before entering the building and to ensure social distancing. <p><u>DISMISSAL</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students will be dismissed out of the closest exit to the classroom. Students will be dismissed by building zones. Once students exit the building, they will report to their bus cone or bus. Students can get on the bus one student at a time. There will be 2 lines with markers that are 6ft apart going up the grass hills for students that are waiting for their bus to arrive. <p><u>RAIN PROCEDURES</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students will be guided by staff to designated locations. Grade 8 will line up 6ft apart in the CAC. (Floors are marked) Grade 7 will line up 6ft apart in the Gym. Grade 6 will line up 6ft apart in the cafeteria. 	<p><u>Face Covering:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Face coverings are required for all persons in a BCPS facility or vehicle as well as on BCPS property. Face coverings are required during transportation to/from school on a bus as well as outdoors on campuses. • Each school, office, and school bus will have a supply of disposable face coverings for students and employees who forget their face covering or whose face covering becomes soiled or damaged.
<p><u>Screening & Stay Home When Appropriate:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All employees and students are expected to screen themselves daily for symptoms of COVID-19. • Remain home if you have symptoms, confirmed COVID-19 illness, had recent contact with a person with COVID-19 and/or awaiting test results. • Parents will receive a screening checklist and magnet with the screening practices. 	<p><u>Social Distancing:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Classroom furniture is arranged to provide 6-foot separation between students, when possible. • Reduce gathering of students in any area – refer to changes in arrival and dismissal procedures and movement in the hallways.
<p><u>Hand Hygiene:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Times for handwashing or use of hand sanitizer to include before and after meals, upon arrival to 	<p><u>Breakfast & Lunch:</u></p> <p>Meals are available to every student at no cost. schools' offices and home, before and after use of any shared items, after use of the restroom, after sneezing/coughing and other time hands are contaminated.

cafeteria by class cohort, socially distanced. There will be 4 lunch shifts. There will be no lunch bunches. Multiple meals will be available on Mondays and Wednesdays for curbside pick-up at all secondary schools, selected elementary schools, and select community sites. There will be reasonable accommodation for special dietary needs. Food items will be individually bagged on disposable trays and utensils. Students will use contactless service, with no pin pads and no self-service of food or milk.

BREAKFAST:

Grab and Go: Upon entering the building, students will grab breakfast bag and continue to class. Students will eat the breakfast in class using a desk shield while they eat. If there is a line, the floor is marked for social distancing.

LUNCH:

Transition to Lunch Procedure

- Students will sanitize exiting the class. Students will also have the ability to sanitize entering the cafeteria.
- Teachers will pick up students from the cafeteria and return to class. Last lunch will report directly to class (period 4). The cafeteria will have a staggered dismissal.

Procedure for Lunch Line

- Students will enter and be seated.
- All café tables will face one direction (4 tables in 8 rows). 2 students per table max. Seats are marked.
- The table will be called.
- Students will stand on social distance markers as they grab their food and return to their seats.

Uniforms, Supplies & Devices:

- Students should attend school with their charged computer devices, pencil/pen, and a notebook
- Students will wear an appropriate school top which is the color of their grade level or magnet.
Grade 6: Green Grade 7: Black Grade 8: Red
- Students will wear appropriate school bottoms. (jeans, khakis, shorts, jogging pants, skirt, etc.)

Visitors:

- To visit a BCPS school, visitors must have an appointment.
- Visits will be conducted remotely or outside, whenever possible.
- If an indoor visit is required, visitors will be required to wear a face coverings and practice social distancing.
- The number of people admitted to the building will be limited.
